HB 1055	Sen. Eric Koch; Rep. Edward DeLaney; Rep. Jerry Torr	Liens. Permits a person to discharge a mechanic's lien by filing an indemnification or payment bond with the recorder's office in an amount equal to at least 150% of the lien. Requires the surety responsible for issuing an indemnification or payment bond to: (1) be authorized to do business in Indiana; and (2) be rated at least "A-" by at least one nationally recognized investment rating service. HB 1062	Sen. Philip Boots; Rep. Daniel Leonard	Unemployment matters. Makes various changes to unemployment compensation law concerning confidentiality, the method of sending notices to claimants and employers, the cap on expenditures from the special employment and training services fund, employing units subject to the Federal Unemployment Tax Act, and appeals regarding seasonal determinations. Updates and eliminates outdated language. Makes technical corrections.	Signed by the President of the Senate Signed by the Governor (4/29)	
HB 1181	Sen. Liz Brown; Sen. Mark Messmer; Rep. Jerry Torr; et al.	Asbestos litigation. Requires certain disclosures regarding asbestos trust claims in civil asbestos actions. Requires a defendant to identify additional trust claims that a defendant believes a plaintiff is eligible for in a written motion (motion). Requires a defendant to disclose, in the defendant's motion, the basis for the defendant's belief that a plaintiff is eligible for an additional trust claim. 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HB 1182	Sen. Chip Perfect; Sen. Philip Boots; Rep. Chuck Moseley; et al.	Worker's compensation. Provides that, for worker's compensation purposes, an employee who leaves work to serve as a volunteer firefighter or member of a volunteer emergency medical services association (volunteer member) is considered an employee of the firefighting unit while in the performance of duties as a volunteer firefighter or volunteer member. Increases the maximum amount of burial expenses that an employer must pay under the worker's compensation act for the burial expenses of a covere...	Signed by the Governor (5/1)	
HB 1278	Sen. Mark Messmer; Sen. Rick Niemeyer; Rep. Sue Errington; et al.	Environmental matters. Establishes the 15 member 21st century energy policy development task force (task force). Requires the task force to: (1) examine and evaluate specified aspects of the state's policies concerning electric generation portfolios; (2) develop recommendations for the general assembly and the governor concerning any identified challenges with respect to Indiana's electric generation portfolios; and (3) issue a report setting forth the task force's recommendations not later than December... HB 1406	Sen. David Niezgodski; Sen. Ed Charbonneau; Sen. Susan Glick; et al.	Water infrastructure assistance fund and program. Provides that money from certain sources in the water infrastructure assistance fund (fund) is continuously appropriated for the purposes of the law concerning the water infrastructure assistance program. Authorizes the authority to establish: (1) the interest rate; or (2) parameters for establishing the interest rate; on each loan made from the fund. Provides that a participant, to receive a loan, grant, or other financial assistance from the fund:...	Signed by the Governor (4/18)	



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HB 1470	Sen. Andy Zay; Sen. David Niezgodski; Sen. Mark Messmer; et al.	Utility transmission improvements and costs. Amends the statute concerning transmission, distribution, and storage system improvements charges (TDSIC) for electric and gas utilities to provide that for purposes of the statute, "eligible transmission, distribution, and storage system improvements" include: (1) projects that do not include specific locations or exact numbers; and (2) advanced technology investments. Provides that a public utility's required plan under the statute (defined under th...	Signed by the Governor (4/24)	
SB 4	Rep. Edmond Soliday; Sen. Andy Zay; Sen. Blake Doriot; et al.	Water and wastewater utilities and runoff. Establishes a storm water management task force to study issues related to storm water management systems. Provides for the task force to consist of: (1) two members of the senate; (2) two members of the house; and (3) other members appointed by the governor. Requires the task force to issue a report setting forth its findings and recommendations not later than December 1, 2019. Provides that the Indiana finance authority (IFA) shall coordinate the executive...	Signed by the Governor Public Law 15 (4/10)	
SB 99	Rep. Heath VanNatter; Sen. Lonnie Randolph; Sen. Greg Walker; et al.	Wage assignments for clothing and tools. Provides that a wage assignment may be made for the rental of uniform shirts, pants, and job-related clothing. Provides that a wage assignment may be made for the purchase of equipment or tools necessary to fulfill the duties of employment. Provides that an employee shall not be charged or subject to a wage assignment for personal protective equipment except for those instances provided under federal rules. 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SB 130	Rep. Doug Miller; Sen. Aaron Freeman; Sen. Chris Garten; et al.	Unemployment insurance matters. Includes in the definition of "employment", for the purposes of the unemployment compensation system, service performed by a driver who provides drive away operations, if the driver is employed by a state or local government entity, a federally recognized Indiana tribe, or a nonprofit organization. Excludes from the definition of "employment", for purposes of the unemployment compensation system, service performed by a driver who provides drive away operations when...	Signed by the Governor Public Law 63 (4/24)	
SB 472	Rep. Edmond Soliday; Sen. Andy Zay; Sen. Blake Doriot; et al.	Utility matters. Provides that an order affecting rates of service may be entered by the utility regulatory commission (IURC) without a formal public hearing in the case of any public or municipally owned utility that either: (1) serves less than 8,000 customers; or (2) has initiated a rate case on behalf of a single division of the utility and that division: (A) serves less than 5,000 customers; and (B) has an IURC-approved schedule of rates and charges that is separate and independent from tha...
