INCMA ENVIRONMENTAL COMMITTEE UPDATE

The INCMA Environmental Affairs Committee met via conference call on Tuesday July 7th. The committee discussed the current COVID-19 virus and impacts on facilities particularly associated



with silica and general compliance. Other topics addressed included multi sector stormwater permits, current beneficial reuse efforts and needs, and miscellaneous reporting deadlines and new obligations. GOODBYE EXTRA \$600?

MARKETWATCH - Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin said Thursday that the Trump administration wants to cap enhanced unemployment benefits in the next coronavirus package to make sure workers do not get benefits amounting to more than their former wages. Under the coronavirus bill enacted in March, workers, to encourage compliance with stay-at-home orders, received as much as \$600 per week in addition to their regular unemployment benefits, which critics say encouraged the jobless to not look for work. "You can assume it will be no more than 100%, so, yes, we want to incent people to go back to work," [Mnuchin told the cable channel CNBC](#).

EPA ENFORCEMENT DISCRETION ENDING

From Barnes & Thornburg, In a June 29th memo, Susan Parker Bodine, assistant administrator for enforcement and compliance assurance at the EPA, announced that relief granted by EPA's March 26 Enforcement Discretion Policy will terminate on Aug. 31, 2020. EPA issued the

policy to provide relief to regulated entities that might have difficulty complying with permitting and regulatory requirements because of the pandemic. It grants broad temporary relief to entities "for violations of routine compliance monitoring, integrity testing, sampling, laboratory analysis, training, and reporting or certification obligations in situations where the EPA agrees that COVID-19 was the cause of the noncompliance..."
