INCMA OPPOSES CHEMICAL TAX

INCMA expressed opposition recently to the US Senate's effort associated with the hard infrastructure bill to reinstate a Superfund tax on 42 chemicals which could impact foundries. The bill moved out of the Senate with the tax increase still included. Stay tuned...

INCMA JOINS AFS TO PROTECT PIG IRON

Earlier this summer, INCMA worked with AFS and other groups to modify a sunset waiver provision for pig iron included in the US Innovation and Competition Act of 2021 being considered by the US Senate. The result was a 5 year extension on the waiver which is a win for foundries!

INCMA JOINS MORE TAX COALITIONS

INCMA recently signed on to two different

coalition letters to the US House Ways and Means Chairman. [The first letter](#) urged the committee NOT to raised taxers on employers as part of infrastructure funding efforts. [The second letter](#) expressed our support for the continuation of the stepped-up basis associated with estate taxes/business transitions. While the battle is young to fund proposed hard and soft infrastructure bills currently pending in Congress - initial funding tool summaries do not include changes to the stepped up basis.

AFS PROVIDES INITIAL SUMMARY OF INFRASTRUCTURE FUNDING TAX CHANGES
